Board-certified in both diagnostic radiology with a certificate of added qualification in pediatric radiology by the American Board of Radiology, Dr. Rooks is an active member of the Society of Pediatric Radiology, the Radiological Society of North America, the World Federation of Pediatric Imaging, Health4TheWorld, the Association of Military Surgeons of the United States, and the Hawaii Radiological Society. As a Fellow of the American College of Radiology, she exemplifies commitment to advancing the field of radiology through education and innovation.

Throughout her illustrious career, Dr. Rooks has received numerous accolades for her contributions to medicine and education. In 2018, she was honored with the University of Vermont Medical Alumni Association Service to Medicine and Community Award and the Jack O. Haller Award for Excellence in Teaching from the Society for Pediatric Radiology. Earlier recognitions include the Outstanding Teacher of the Year at Tripler Army Medical Center in 2013, and the Excellence and Innovation in Case Presentation Award in 2010. Dr. Rooks also earned the O2M3, Order of Military Medical Merit as well as "A" Designator from the US Army Surgeon General in 2010, the highest recognition for professional excellence in the Army Medical Department.
