Mr. Ashok, Child Development Project Officer – State Project ICDS, addressed the gathering, urging parents to leverage Anganwadi services for their children's early development. The event concluded with a **felicitation ceremony**, recognizing the invaluable contributions of Anganwadi teachers and helpers for their dedication and service to early childhood education.
