Born on February 7, 2007, in Detroit, Michigan, Cayden grew up acutely aware of the challenges young people face within broken systems. His journey as an advocate began at just 6 years old, during his parents' divorce and custody battle. Witnessing the system's inability to prioritize the voices of children became the driving force behind his life's work. By 16, he was already making waves as a leading advocate, winning every case he argued in Oakland County Teen Court — a recognition that first placed him in the public eye.

"It feels surreal," said Cayden Brown, Founder and CEO of <u>The Trespass Project</u>. "I've spent over half of my life now fighting for children's voices to be heard — all while being a child myself."

Over the past few years, Brown has taken his message from his hometown to the highest stages in the world. He has addressed global leaders at the United Nations as the youngest speaker on the dais, stood before policymakers at the Department of Justice, and collaborated with prominent activists, including Colin Kaepernick's Know Your Rights Camp, where he was the youngest speaker, and Bryan Stevenson. His work has been recognized by organizations like Forbes, TIME, and The Skillman Foundation, cementing his reputation as a changemaker on a global scale. "It's incredible to see the seeds we planted a few years ago take root," he reflects.

For someone who has achieved so much before the age of 18, Brown remains focused on the work ahead. With a book in the works and a packed 2025 calendar, adulthood promises to be even more impactful than his teenage years. "Becoming an adult doesn't mean I'll stop fighting for kids. It means I'll be the ally I never had," Brown shares.

As Cayden steps into adulthood, his work continues to inspire. Thank you, Cayden, for everything you did to protect kids while you were one.

Five Facts About Cayden Brown:

- **He started young:** Cayden's advocacy began at age six, during his parents' divorce and custody battle, which showed him the need for people willing to listen to kid's voices in the legal system.
- A perfect record in the courtroom: By 16, Cayden earned his place as a defender in the Oakland County Teen Court and won every case he argued.
- A global presence: At just 17 years old, Cayden was invited to speak on the dais of the United Nations Headquarters as the youngest of five youths chosen from around the world to address global peace.
- Collaborator with legends: Cayden has worked with several notable activists including Colin Kaepernick, working as his youngest speaker, Bryan Stevenson.
- An awarded leader and educator: Cayden has won several awards for his advocacy and leadership, including being the youngest 'Youth Justice Advocate Award' winner and

Educational Achievement Awardee signed by a former U.S. President.
