Within only 7 months, Kris had turned her dropshipping business into a **highly profitable machine**, generating over **\$10 million in revenue**. She now **owns the very apartment she was nearly evicted from**, along with **a real estate and business investment portfolio spanning three countries.**

And now? She's proven that the same business principles that built her e-commerce success can be applied to the music industry.

What is Dropshipping? And How Can It Work for Music?

Dropshipping is an e-commerce model where businesses sell products without holding inventory. When a customer places an order, the product is shipped directly from the supplier. The key to success? **High-volume sales, smart automation, and precise marketing—**the exact same strategies Kris is now using to dominate **music streaming**.

With platforms like Spotify, music is the **product**. Each stream generates income, just like each sale in an online store. **The more songs you release, the more streams you accumulate, and the higher the income**.

So, Kris **treated her music career like a business—**and it worked.

Turning Spotify Into a Passive Income Stream

Currently, Kris has **five songs**, **each around three minutes long**. With an average payout of **\$0.05 per stream**, she's set to generate approximately **\$97,000 per year from 5.3 million annual streams**. Kris approached Spotify the same way she did e-commerce:

- Consistent Releases Just like dropshippers constantly add new products, Kris releases music regularly to keep engagement high.
- Targeted Digital Marketing She doesn't wait for people to find her music—she markets it directly to those most likely to stream it.
- Automation & Scaling Streaming revenue is reinvested into further marketing, creating a
 cycle of continuous growth—just like reinvesting profits in e-commerce.

Her music, which focuses on **empowerment and healing from narcissistic abuse**, has built a loyal audience who streams her songs consistently.

Karma Always Wins

Looking back, Kris has no doubt that **karma is real.**

"I was bullied so badly in school, but guess what? **No one from back then is living the life I have now.**" she laughs. "Looks like I won in the end."

Gratitude First—But Health & Happiness Above All

While Kris is grateful for her financial success, she knows **money isn't everything.** She credits her achievements to **God above** and remains deeply thankful for all she has. But at the end of the day, **health and happiness matter more than wealth.**

"I've been at the bottom, and I've been at the top," she says. "The most important thing is your peace, your well-being, and your faith. **Money is just a tool—but happiness is everything.**"
