teammates and thank my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

Lastly, Ay'Anna Moody, Senior Director of Social Impact for the Warriors Foundation, was honored with the 2025 Slam Dunk Community Service Award, recognizing her dedication to uplifting the community.

The event also gained energy as local heroes were honored for their outstanding contributions to the community. Recognized were Pastor Mike McBride of *Live Free USA*, who moved mountains to ensure ASGC shined, and community advocate Mistah.
