- Cards are small and hand-made. Each one features a short piece of original writing on a 5x7 card. It's small, bite-sized, and unique.
- The written art cards are created by writers who are sharing their insights and talents. The cards are given freely with the intention of making a positive impact on readers.
- The written art is being distributed through a network of Little Free Library owners across the country who want to help build community and expand access to written materials.

"Some of the most powerful pieces of art come from the hearts of writers who are empowered to deeply express themselves – and given a pathway to connect with readers," said Melanie Steele, founder of Little Written Art. "We know readers across the county value art and long for genuine, heartfelt messages and ideas that they can connect with and relate to. Our vision is to have Little Written Art accessible to everyone who could benefit from it."

Throughout 2025, the Little Written Art project aims to welcome more original pieces of written art from writers and make them available in more communities across the country.
