The explosive rise and chaotic fall of one of America's most notorious music venues takes center stage in *Bloody & Bruised: The Untold Story of The Back Room*—a feature-length documentary that's turning heads on the 2025 festival circuit. The untold story of the most infamous heavy metal club to live and die in Austin, Texas, as told by the people who survived it.

This isn't nostalgia. It's an unflinching, blood-and-beer-soaked dive into a venue that birthed careers, broke bones, and left permanent scars on a generation of artists and fans. Meticulously crafted over 4.5

years, the film draws on nearly 70 interviews with musicians, staff, journalists, and diehard regulars—combined with thousands of archival materials and stylized reenactments—to reconstruct a legacy as vital as it was volatile.

A Documentary That Doesn't Look Away

Bloody & Bruised peels back the mythology to confront the brutal, beautiful reality of The Back Room. From the early '70s outlaw country days to the metal reign of the '80s, through the grunge surge and early 2000s punk and metal revivals, the club's transformation mirrors decades of cultural rebellion. Stories include:

- **Pearl Jam's early set** for 35 people.
- **Pantera's "secret show"** that nearly collapsed the venue.
- **A riot incited by 2 Live Crew** in 1996.
- **The Dangerous Toys' record deal**, inked during SXSW '88.
- **The rise and tragic fall of Pariah, which birthed the SIMS foundation**

Directed by a Veteran, Told by Survivors

J. Budro Partida—fresh off winning *Best Male Filmmaker of the Year* at the 2025 Austin Revolution Film Festival—calls this the most demanding work of his 30-year career. Backed by producers John R. Jew Jr., Adam Salinas, Tamara Salem Moore, and **executive producer Ray Seggern and co-executive producer, David Moskowitz**, the film carries decades of lived experience, from the pit to the mixing board.

Moore, a former general manager and talent buyer for The Back Room, offers first-hand accounts that pierce through nostalgia and expose the grit beneath the glory. Seggern, a former radio personality and Back Room alumnus, contributes both historical insight and personal testimony.

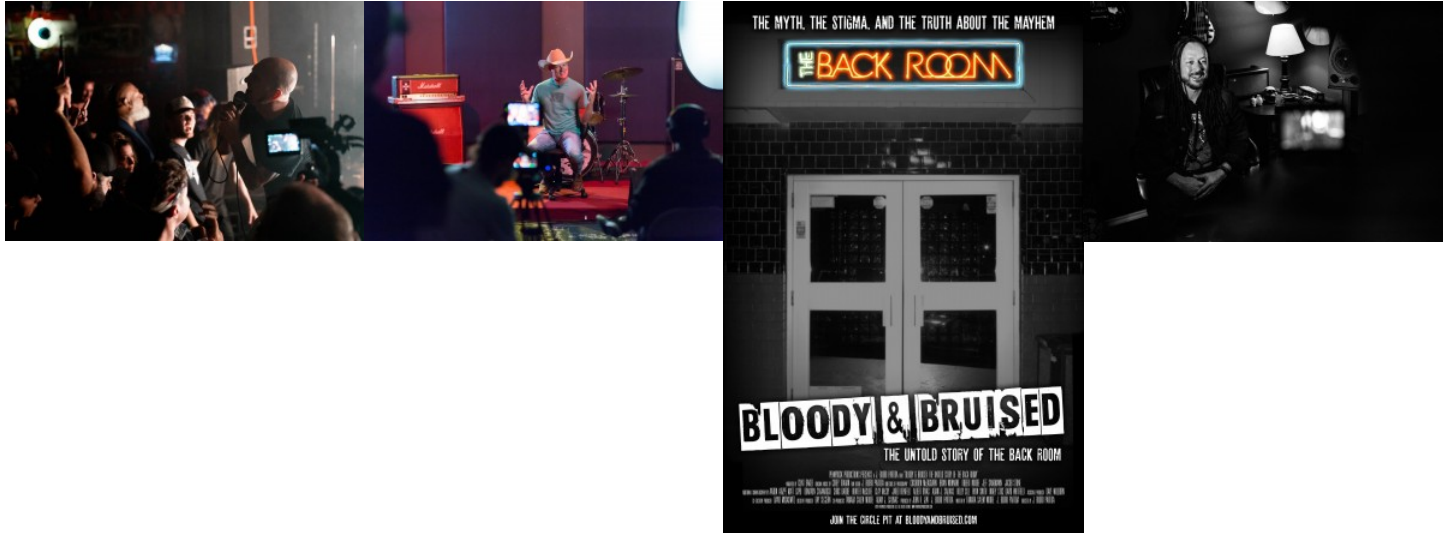
