"Chinese + Skills" Talent Training Program Delegation Arrives in China



Wuhan, Hubei May 13, 2025 (Issuewire.com) - On May 8, 2025, the first group of 10 management trainees from top Indonesian universities departed Jakarta for Wuhan, China, embarking on a six-month journey of learning and working. These students, selected from Indonesia's leading technical universities, including Bandung Institute of Technology and Diponegoro University, were selected through the "Chinese + Skills" talent training program, jointly launched by Go Study Global Education (Go Study) and PT. CCEPC Indonesia. They were outstanding candidates who passed multiple rounds of corporate interviews.

Since 2023, Go Study and CCEPC have jointly promoted local school-enterprise cooperation in Indonesia. This project was showcased as a flagship initiative at the Business Matching 2024: Indonesia-Education China-Industry Talk and also recognized as a flagship project under the Go Internship Program. Over the past three years, more than 350 candidates from Indonesian institutions were interviewed, recruiting 71 local skilled talents, effectively supporting enterprises in building localized talent systems. Currently, partnerships have been established with 15 key Indonesian universities, including top 10 institutions like Bandung Institute of Technology, Diponegoro University, and Binus University.

This China visit program marks a strategic upgrade in their collaboration. After six months of preparation, 22 were selected from over a hundred applicants, with 12 representatives chosen for further training at the Chinese headquarters—a critical step toward internationalized talent development.

To ensure the students adapt smoothly to life and studying in China, Go Study assisted in the entire preparation process, including interfacing with universities, student selection, language training, visa and schedule arrangements, and collaborated with Chinese vocational colleges to offer online Chinese language and cultural courses.

On the evening of May 8, the 10 Indonesian trainees arrived smoothly in Wuhan. Mr. Yu Qi, General Manager of Go Study, along with representatives from CCEPC and Chinese institutions, greeted them at Wuhan Tianhe International Airport. The next day, an opening ceremony was held at the partner university. The representatives from the university stated that the arrival of these trainees not only marks a significant achievement in its internationalization efforts but also represents a milestone in Sino-Indonesian deep collaboration in environmental protection and energy sectors, as well as joint talent development.

Alvy from Bandung Institute of Technology made a speech as a student representative. Coming from a remote village in Indonesia, this was her first trip abroad. During her internship at the Weda Bay Industrial Park, she gained in-depth knowledge of energy systems. In China, she will systematically study energy technologies at the headquarters, aspiring to contribute to environmental improvements in Indonesia.


As Chinese enterprises expand overseas, demand for local talent continues to grow. By establishing a win-win collaboration model among governments, enterprises, universities, and students, Go Study not only meets corporate talent needs but also opens doors for Southeast Asian youth to access broader opportunities.

Go Study firmly believes that "education is the best path for globalization." Since responding to the Ministry of Education's "Going Global with Enterprises" initiative in 2022, Go Study has leveraged its overseas educational resources to provide Chinese enterprises with an integrated solution combining school-enterprise collaboration and local talent recruitment. Services span industries such as construction, transportation, energy, electronics, e-commerce, and logistics, assisting over 50 Chinese enterprises in establishing localized talent systems in Southeast Asia.

In April 2024, under the "Merdeka Belajar" education policy framework promoted by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of Indonesia, Go Study responded to the "Kampus Merdeka" initiative — a program that encourages university students to gain practical experience through in-depth internships and prepare for their future careers — by officially launching the Go Internship program. The initiative was first unveiled at the Business Matching 2024: Indonesia-Education China-Industry Talk. Within just six months, Go Study organized 19 on-campus events, engaged over 1,500 students, offered more than 500 internship positions, and placed over 200 professionally matched interns with overseas enterprises in each session.

By bridging China and Southeast Asia through education, the "Chinese+Skills" initiative empowers youth for the times. As more young individuals like Alvy strive toward their futures, we are witnessing cross-border collaboration and transformative potential unfolding.
