Sent on missionary journeys across the globe—from Iowa to Malaysia—he endured trauma, violence, and emotional abandonment. Yet through it all, he found glimmers of joy, adventure, and eventually, spiritual strength and forgiveness that would shape the man he became.


"This book is about freedom—even when the world is stacked against you," Marshall says.
