
Yau Gofan, DNP, APRN: Leading in Advanced Nursing & Education with Purposeful Healing and Passionate Teaching

This two-part project will utilize both cross-sectional and longitudinal methods to assess the impact of storytelling on emotional health, filling a crucial gap in existing research.

Dr. Gofan is an active member of several professional organizations, including the Michigan Nurse Practitioners Association, the American Association of Nurse Practitioners, and the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses. These affiliations reflect her dedication to advancing nursing practice and advocating for patients.

At the heart of Dr. Gofan's motivation lies her passion for mentoring future nurses and her commitment to supporting patients during their most critical moments. She believes that every interaction provides an opportunity to make a meaningful difference in someone's life. "My success is rooted in my ability to educate and empower the next generation of nurses," she shares. "I find purpose in my work every day."
