This trip can also be combined with salmon fishing.

From Kenai, this trip is also accessible by float plane, and the flight takes just 15 minutes. After landing on Big River Lakes we will board a small Jon Boat and run over to a small creek where salmon are congregated we will stay in the boat the entire time waiting for a bear to come out to try to catch a fish, we usually always see bears on this trip but mostly small sub adult cubs that have just been kicked out from mom.
