She also carries a personal mission with her every time she steps on the mat. After losing her sister in a tragic car accident as a teen, Brumbaugh lives by a simple truth: **life is short: chase the podium, the dreams, and the goals now, not later. Time is promised to no one.**

"This year I earned an LLM in Privacy Law from USC and a Worlds medal from a sport I love. I'm not waiting for someday."

Grateful for her coaches, training partners, and the entire community that's supported her, Brumbaugh now looks ahead to the rest of the season with one goal: keep climbing.
