He is also a founding member of the Ankle Instability Group, an international consortium focused on advancing the understanding and treatment of ankle instability. His innovative contributions, such as the co-invention of the ArthroBrostrom technique, underscore his commitment to improving surgical outcomes for patients with lateral ankle ligament instability.

As an esteemed educator, Dr. Mangone has shared his knowledge and research at numerous national and international conferences, contributing significantly to the advancement of foot and ankle surgery. He has multiple patents pending for innovative surgical devices, further demonstrating his dedication to enhancing patient care through technology and innovation. Dr. Mangone attributes his success to his unwavering commitment to patient care and the invaluable support of his colleagues and mentors throughout his career.
