Cross-border collaboration will connect women entrepreneurs in Michigan and Cameroon through capacity building and mentorship programs

The historic agreement establishes a comprehensive cross-border exchange program designed to empower women entrepreneurs across two continents.

The MoU was signed by **Tonya McNeal-Weary**, Founder of MAFE, and **Gilles Lewat**, Managing Director of GEN Cameroon, during the Global Entrepreneurship Congress. Bridging Continents Through Entrepreneurship

The three-year partnership will facilitate the exchange of female entrepreneurs, business experts, coaches, and mentors between Michigan and Cameroon, with a primary focus on building the capacity of Cameroonian women entrepreneurs. The program aims to create sustainable business partnerships while transferring critical knowledge and best practices in business development, scaling, and international market access.

"This partnership represents a pivotal moment in our mission to empower women entrepreneurs globally," said Tonya McNeal-Weary, Founder of MAFE. "By connecting the vibrant entrepreneurial ecosystems of Michigan and Cameroon, we're not just sharing knowledge – we're building bridges that will create lasting economic opportunities for women on both sides of the Atlantic."

Gilles Lewat, Managing Director of GEN Cameroon, emphasized the transformative potential of the collaboration: "Through this collaboration, we are creating a dynamic exchange that will fundamentally transform how Cameroonian women entrepreneurs access global markets, scale their businesses, and compete on the international stage. We anticipate this partnership will catalyze a new generation of globally minded Cameroonian women entrepreneurs who will, in turn, become mentors and investors in their communities, creating a multiplier effect that extends far beyond the program's initial scope," said Lewat.

Comprehensive Program Framework

The exchange program will feature multiple components designed to maximize impact:

- Expert Exchange Visits: Two annual delegations of Michigan-based female entrepreneurs and business experts will travel to Cameroon for intensive capacity-building initiatives, and one yearly delegation of Cameroon-based entrepreneurs will travel to Michigan for a business immersion trip
- **Skills Development Training**: Comprehensive workshops covering business strategy, financial management, digital marketing, international trade, and leadership development
- **Mentorship Networks**: Long-term mentoring relationships between experienced Michigan entrepreneurs and emerging Cameroonian business leaders
- Partnership Facilitation: Platforms for establishing joint ventures, collaborations, and business partnerships
- Virtual Collaboration: Quarterly online networking sessions and digital learning opportunities

Global Endorsement and Recognition

Jonathan Ortmans, President of GEN Global, praised the partnership during the signing ceremony. The signing took place on June 4, during GEC 2025, the world's largest gathering of entrepreneurs, which brings together thousands of startup founders, investors, researchers, and policymakers from more than 170 countries.

Economic Impact and Vision

The partnership addresses critical needs in both regions. Michigan's robust entrepreneurial ecosystem, supported by world-class universities and established industries, offers valuable expertise for emerging markets. Meanwhile, Cameroon's dynamic and growing economy presents significant opportunities for collaboration and market expansion.

"We're not just creating a program – we're building a movement that recognizes the power of women entrepreneurs to drive economic transformation," added McNeal-Weary. "This partnership will serve as a model for similar collaborations across Africa and beyond."
