Nestled in the northwest corner of California, twenty miles south of the Oregon border, at the midpoint between borders of Canada and Mexico, this enchanted coastal region of <u>Crescent City</u> is sandwiched between the Pacific Ocean and the tallest trees in the world, the revered Giant Redwoods.
