B. Saroja Devi has received the Padma Shri and Padma Bhushan due to her extensive career and lifetime contributions to the industry. She was the vice-president of the Kannada Chalanchitra Sangha and also participated as a jury for the 53rd National Film Awards. She has also made a record by being the first actress to act in a lead role for 161 consecutive movies, talk about legacy! 26 consecutive films in her career are hit projects, and that is enough to showcase her caliber. The legend will be missed by the fans and all personalities from the Indian film industry.
