

When it comes to handling dry conditions, both grasses perform well, but Bermuda grass is the winner in drought tolerance due to its deep roots and ability to bounce back quickly after long periods without rain. While Zoysia is also drought-tolerant, it may take longer to recover if it turns brown during dry spells.

Cold Tolerance

Zoysia, on the other hand, is more adaptable, capable of growing in a wider range of soil types, including sandy, loamy, or clay-heavy soils. thick, cushiony feel. Bermuda has a coarser texture, which might feel a bit rougher.
