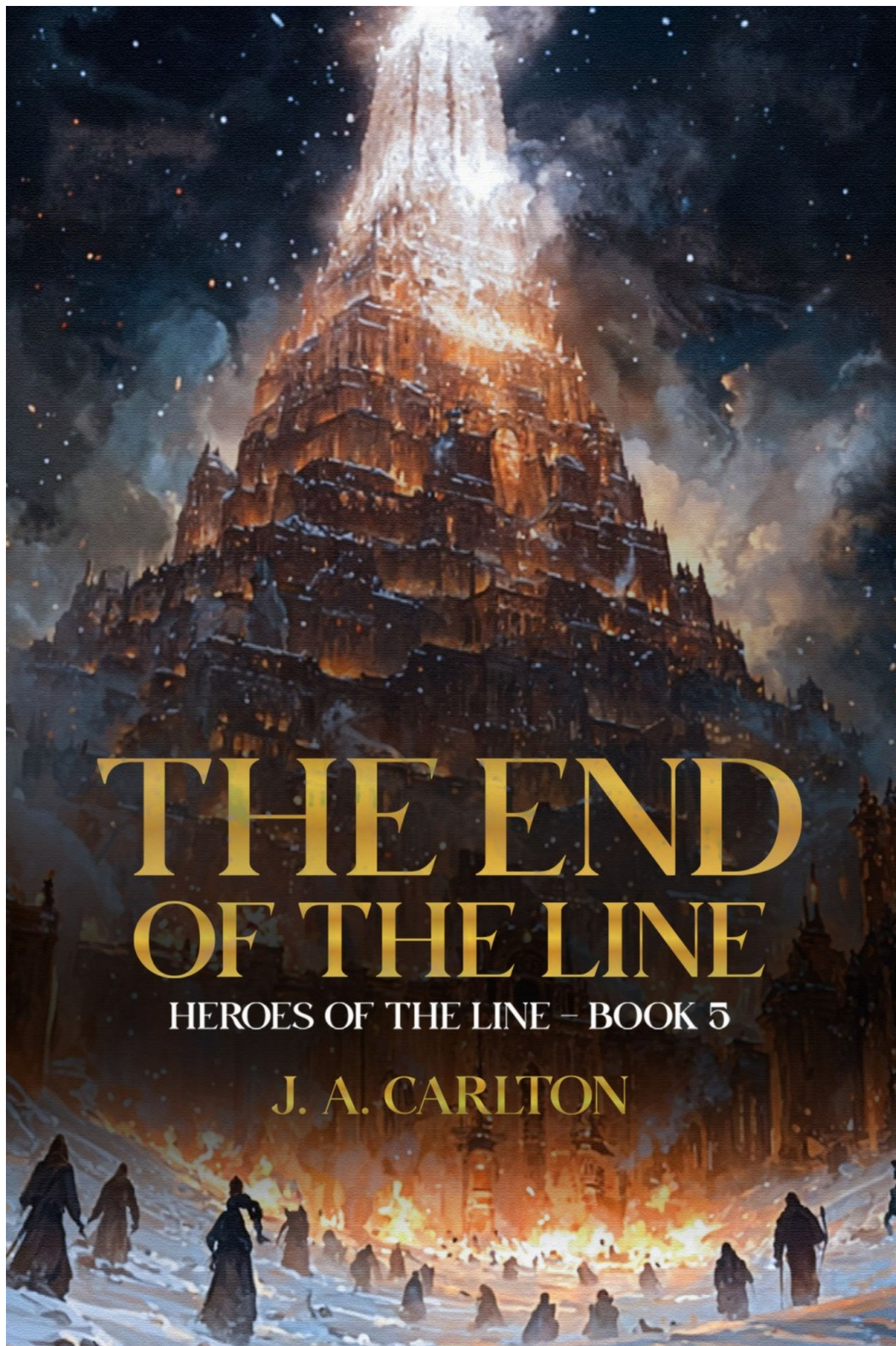


Kirkus Praises the Thrilling Finale of J.A. Carlton's Heroes of the Line Series
