These special nights at top Whitefish restaurants unite renowned visiting chefs with local culinary stars for one-night-only collaborations. From slow-roasted elk with bold cabernet to wild huckleberries paired with dessert wine, each dish is a love letter to Montana's seasonal bounty.

Still, indulgence isn't the only focus. In its inaugural year, the festival supported local organizations dedicated to improving food access and education. In 2025, two new nonprofit partners will be announced, with select events designed to benefit their missions directly.

"The community has embraced this festival in a way that's been incredibly rewarding," says co-founder Joe Hess. "We're not just bringing people here to eat and drink—we're creating lasting connections between visitors and Whitefish itself."

That spirit of connection permeates every moment of the festival. There are no exclusive lounges or velvet ropes. Attendees share space—and stories—with chefs, winemakers, and artisans. Whether sipping rosé post-demo or chatting under the pines, the lines between guest and host blur in the best possible way.

Tickets are now available, and accommodations are booking up fast. Whether you're a dedicated foodie, a nature enthusiast, or simply someone craving an unforgettable autumn escape, Whitefish Food & Wine offers a singular experience that blends the best of culinary excellence with Montana's natural magic.
