Film as a Continuation of a Real Legacy

Salmon follows Joseph's journey beyond the headlines — through a life-altering injury caused by a hunting accident, and toward emotional recovery via the quiet tradition of fishing. Madsen had signed on to portray an aging mechanic who becomes a pivotal mentor to Joseph's healing. While Madsen is no longer with us, his creative energy and belief in this tale remain central to its continuation.

"Michael didn't take projects lightly," says Koepp. "He had nothing to prove — he simply believed this story could move people. That belief is our compass now."

The story was recently chronicled in the Amazon #1 New Release *Hooked on Hope*, co-authored by Joseph and Koepp. Through personal reflection and fishing metaphors, the book navigates Joseph's

recovery journey—his brain injury, his evolving communication, and his path toward healing—and has resonated deeply with readers focused on resilience and recovery.

The film will serve as a visual companion piece — expanding the message to new audiences.
