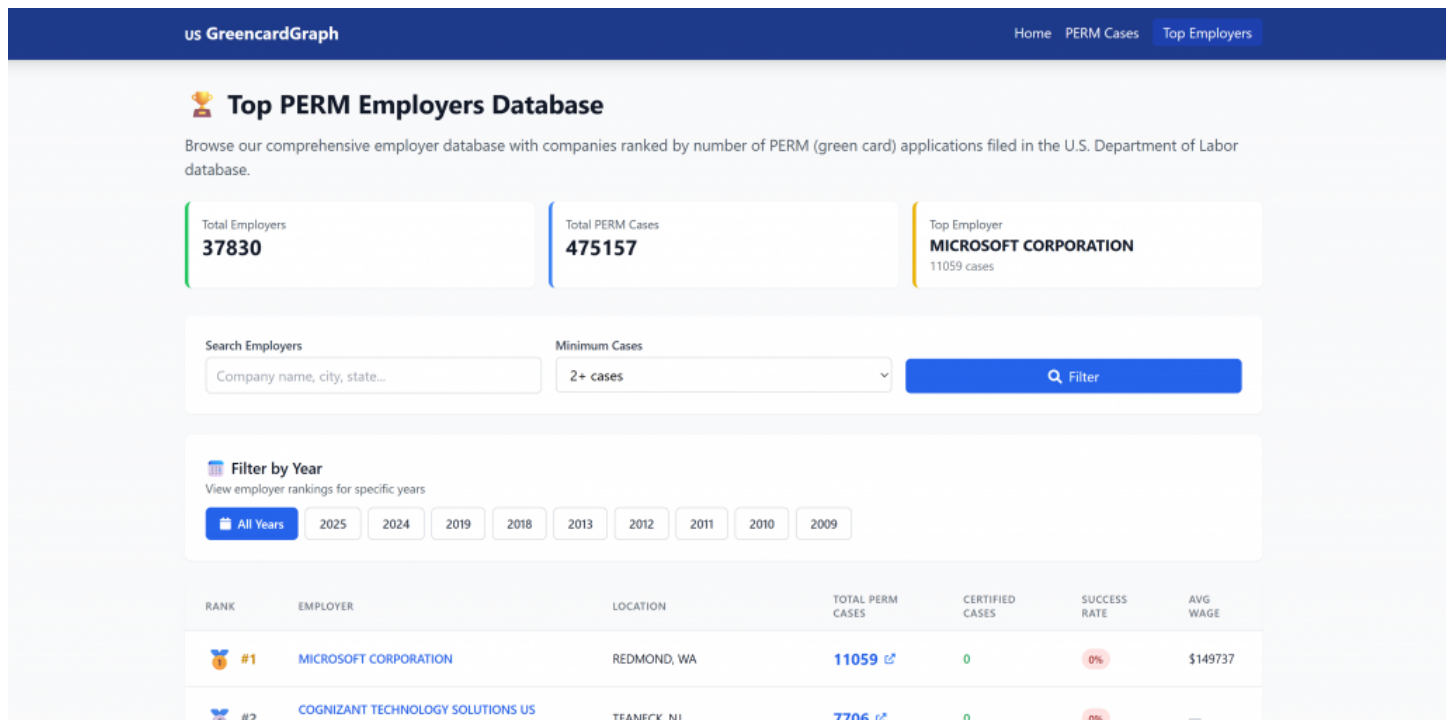


New Website GreenCardGraph.com Makes U.S. Immigration Data More Accessible to the Public
