Key Components of Logistics

Order Fulfillment

In supply chain management, fulfillment is the phase of receiving goods and delivering orders to customers. Usually, it begins when a customer places an order and ends once the product is received.

In-house: Manages all parts of order processing. From inventory to order transportation.

Outsourced: Involves a business working with a third-party logistics (3PL) provider to manage some or all parts of order fulfillment, such as *inventory control*, *material handling*, *and cargo shipping*.

Dropshipping: A method where retailers sell products without keeping them in a warehouse. For example, when a customer orders, the retailer passes the request to a third-party supplier that ships the product directly to the customer.

Hybrid: Multiple fulfillment strategies that aim to improve efficiency and meet diverse customer needs.

Freight Forwarding

This process is handled by an experienced cargo shipping company to ensure that products will be safely transported from the warehouse to the customers.

Additionally, freight forwarders manage the risks and benefits of shipping by negotiating tariffs and import restrictions.

Warehousing and Distribution

An organized warehouse helps you store and deliver your products efficiently. In many ways, excellent <u>warehouse management</u> can be a significant competitive advantage.

Supply Chain Management

Involves analyzing and improving the entire supply chain process. From sourcing raw materials to delivering finished products. It covers *demand forecasting*, *procurement*, *inventory management*, *and order fulfillment*.

Transportation

One of the most critical activities handled by a <u>logistics provider</u>. It is the logistics company's responsibility to arrange the mode of transportation depending on the requirements of the order shipment.
