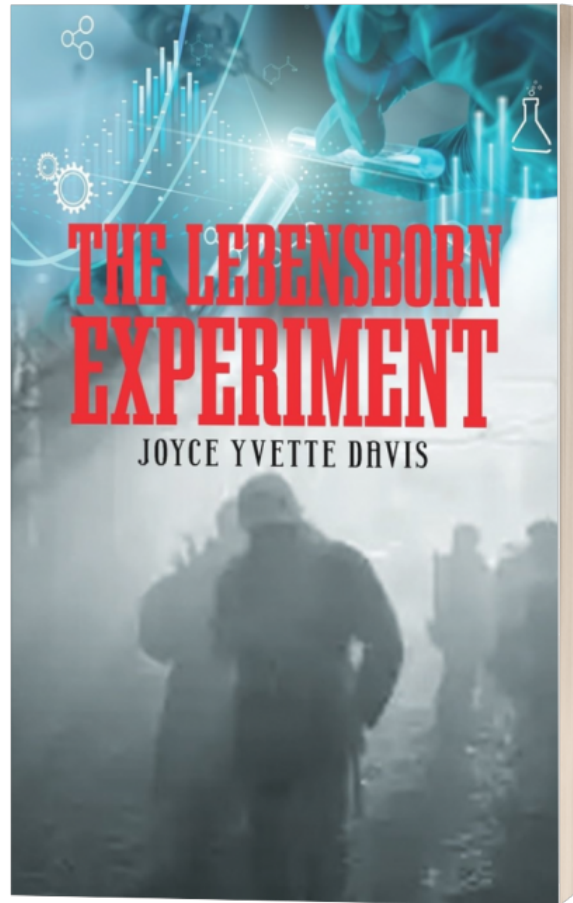


A Supernatural Thriller Rooted in WWII History: “The Lebensborn Experiment Unleashes a New Kind of Soldier”
