"She'd seen me singing Sisi on television and thought immediately — that's my Emma Bovary. I was so honoured, and from that first call, I felt an instant spark."

"I think it becomes more beautiful every time I listen to it. It might have a positive influence on my development as a singer as well." That blend of classical depth and modern emotion feels like the right

direction for me."

The Cultural Resonance

By transforming Flaubert's story into music, Madame Bovary: Her Story in Music creates a dialogue between the 19th century and today. It brings timeless human emotion into a form that modern audiences can feel, not just read.
