From Hinduism, Buddhism to Islam... 500 Global Religious Leaders Gather in Korea to Study the Book of Revelation

Leading exchange and peace through testimony of Revelation's fulfillment and interfaith discussion forums



Chicago, **Illinois Nov 11**, **2025** (<u>Issuewire.com</u>) - An unprecedented international event discussing religious harmony through the "Bible" will be held in Korea amid ongoing religious conflicts.

Chairman Lee Man-hee, announced on October 30 that it will host the "3rd Special Lecture on Revelation Open to All Nations" in Cheongju from October 30 to November 2. The event will be held under the theme, "The Path of Understanding Led by the Bible, the Path of Peace Walked Together by Religions."

The Special Lecture on Revelation Open to All Nations is an international exchange program promoting interfaith dialogue and peace centered on the prophecies and fulfillment recorded in the New Testament's Book of Revelation. This special lecture, which began in Korea, has been gaining global attention as participation continues to double with each session.

The first special lecture, held in February 2024, included about 80 leaders from 10 religious orders across 28 countries, including Korea. The second special lecture graduated approximately 270 religious leaders from 57 countries.

After the second special lecture, many participants shared that the experience inspired spiritual growth, leaving testimonials such as, "I want to come back with fellow religious leaders to learn at the third event," "I will spread today's inspiration upon returning to my country," and "This program will become

an international event in the future."

This year's event will be the largest to date, with more than 1,000 participants, including 521 religious leaders from 61 countries. With participation transcending denominations and faith traditions, the Korea-originated biblical program is being recognized as a leading platform for global interreligious dialogue.

Participants have expressed agreement with Chairman Lee Man-hee's proposal to "know the fundamental meaning of religion through scriptures, understand each other, and become one."

Over the four-day, three-night program, religious leaders will study and discuss the fulfilled reality of Revelation—the core and conclusion of Christian scripture—while seeking solutions for humanity's peace. Through discussion, they aim to affirm how God's will is being fulfilled on Earth and broaden interfaith understanding.

Beyond lectures on the fulfilled reality of Revelation, various programs leading religious culture are scheduled, including:

- ▲ Scripture experience programs
- ▲ World Religious Leaders' Revelation Contest and Awards Ceremony
- ▲ Animation screening of Revelation
- ▲ Sculpture exhibition about Revelation
- ▲ Honorary Interfaith Educator appointment ceremony.

Additionally, venues for interfaith understanding and solidarity have been prepared, including

- ▲ United prayer meetings across religions under the theme of "Peace"
- ▲ Presentations on peace initiatives by religious leaders
- ▲ Roundtable discussions to develop local models for religious harmony

A Shincheonji Church official stated,"This special lecture is an opportunity to confirm that the Bible is not just one religion's scripture but contains common truths for achieving human peace." The official added, "We expect this to be an occasion to understand each other's faith through scriptures and restore religion's original mission of peace and harmony."
