Why now

Swiping has entered a backlash era, and big platforms are racing to bolt AI onto legacy experiences.

Analysts note the category's malaise and debate whether AI will fix or worsen the core issues of fatigue and low trust; either way, offline quality time is back at the center of the conversation.

Meanwhile, a new wave of AI matchmaking startups is cutting chat entirely—planning first dates and nudging users back into the real world—signaling a broader product shift from screen time to show-up time.

- Tell us your weekend: share your available time windows, basic profile, and conversation comfort levels.
- Our AI seats the table: small-group constraints (6 seats) optimize for vibe, diversity, and safety.
- Meet IRL: show up to a vetted venue, phones down by default, icebreakers optional.
- Feedback → better tables: lightweight post-brunch signals help the system improve future seating.

What makes it different

- Offline-first by design No endless DMs. Your weekend plan is the product.
- Tables, not "matches" Six people create more surface area for opportunities (friends, cofounders, leads, even romance) without the pressure of 1:1 dates.
- Safety & comfort Group seating, clear norms, and anti-harassment policies make it easier—especially for women—to try new circles with low awkwardness.
- Cross-city culture Active in Taipei, Hong Kong, Seoul, Singapore, Vienna, and Los Angeles, with additional cities in review.

Early signals

Members commonly report three outcomes within their first few tables:

- New friends & local belonging when arriving in a new city,
- Warm professional leads (coffee chats, intros, freelance briefs),
- Romance that starts as conversation—not as a profile swipe. These trends mirror the broader industry pivot toward less chat, more meet—but place the meeting inside a group ritual rather than a pressure-filled 1:1, which experts suggest is where AI can add structure without hollowing out authenticity.

"Al should be the invisible host—not the relationship," added the CEO. "We built WKND CLUB so you can leave the app at the door: arrive, sit, eat, talk. If there's magic, it comes from people—our job is to engineer the room."
