Since its establishment in 2012, World Mediation Forum has championed professional standards in

Services were assessed across six core criteria: professional accreditation and qualifications (25%), experience and track record (25%), specialisation and expertise (20%), client feedback and reputation (15%), accessibility and service quality (10%), and transparency and professionalism (5%).
