In partnership with Curtis Hamer of 2H Longhorns, Angela Svonavec guide the program's standards, long-term planning, and herd development strategy at Banshee Farms in Rockwood.

The initiative focuses on strengthening Texas Longhorn genetics for breeders across Pennsylvania and the broader Northeast. Located in the Laurel Highlands, Banshee Farms provides mountain pasture and managed grazing systems designed to support herd health, fertility, and long-term sustainability.

“Our goal is consistency,” said [Angela Svonavec](#). “We are pairing proven bloodlines with sound management practices so breeders know what to expect from our program year after year.”

The breeding program is housed at Banshee Farms and reflects a structured selection process. Each pairing is evaluated for pedigree strength, conformation, maternal traits, and long-term herd impact. Rather than emphasizing volume, the team prioritizes limited, carefully planned releases of breeding stock and genetics.

Jason Svonavec, along with Curtis Hamer and Ron Schmuck , oversee day-to-day operations and long-range planning for the farm. His background in Somerset County agriculture informs the program's operational standards. [Angela Svonavec](#) to ensure the herd aligns with clearly defined benchmarks for quality and manageability.

Curtis Hamer, founder of 2H Longhorns, contributes established bloodlines and breeding insight to the partnership. The collaboration allows the Pennsylvania-based program to integrate respected genetics while maintaining strict selection criteria at the local level.

Cattle within the program graze on native pastureland in Rockwood, where elevation and climate conditions contribute to herd durability. The environment supports strong hoof health, adaptive grazing behavior, and steady growth patterns. These conditions align with the long-term objective of producing cattle suited for diverse Northeast ranch environments.

Angela Svonavec has emphasized measurable standards in the development of the herd. Priority traits include:

- Genetic consistency across generations
- Correct structure and balanced conformation
- Docile temperament and ease of handling
- Long-term health and environmental adaptability
- Clear pedigree documentation for registered stock

By focusing on these criteria, Angela Svonavec and the Banshee Farms team aim to provide dependable breeding options for serious Longhorn programs. The farm plans to release select animals and genetic pairings to approved buyers seeking predictable performance and responsible herd

development.

The expansion reflects a broader commitment to structured growth rather than rapid scaling. Each season builds on documented results from prior breeding cycles. Performance, fertility rates, and calf development are tracked to inform future pairings.

Angela Svonavec's involvement reinforces the farm's emphasis on long-term planning. She works to align breeding decisions with sustainable land use and herd management practices that preserve both pasture quality and livestock health.

Through this partnership with 2H Longhorns, Banshee Farms strengthens its position as a developing source of registered Texas Longhorn cattle in the Northeast. The program combines local agricultural roots with disciplined breeding standards.
