The Internal Revenue Service processes millions of tax returns each year, and many taxpayers rely on refund schedules to estimate when they might receive their refund payments. In most cases, taxpayers who file electronically and select direct deposit receive their refund within about 21 days after the IRS accepts the return, according to IRS guidance.

Example: A taxpayer whose return is accepted in early February may receive their refund sometime between mid-February and late February if the return is filed electronically and direct deposit is selected.

The timing of refunds can vary depending on how the return was filed. [Electronic filing combined with direct deposit is generally the fastest method](#), while paper returns often take significantly longer for the

IRS to process.

Example: A taxpayer who files a paper return by mail may wait six weeks or more to receive a refund compared with the faster processing times available through electronic filing.

The 2026 tax filing season began in late January, with millions of taxpayers submitting returns in the early weeks of the season. Early filers often receive refunds sooner because IRS processing systems are less congested at the beginning of the filing period.

Example: A taxpayer who files a return during the first week of the filing season may see their refund arrive earlier than someone who files in March when processing volumes are higher.

Some tax credits may also affect refund timing. Federal law requires the IRS to delay refunds for certain returns claiming refundable credits, such as the Earned Income Tax Credit or the Additional Child Tax Credit, to allow additional verification time.

Example: Taxpayers claiming these credits may not receive their refunds until later in the filing season, even if they file early.

The National Tax Reports guide includes a tax refund schedule chart showing estimated refund windows based on when a return is accepted by the IRS. While the chart provides helpful estimates, the IRS does not guarantee specific refund dates because processing times can vary depending on return accuracy, identity verification checks, or other review procedures.

Tax experts generally recommend filing electronically and selecting direct deposit to receive refunds as quickly as possible. The IRS also provides online tools that allow taxpayers to track refund status after filing.
