


A Speculative Thriller Dares to Answer: Who Is Satoshi Nakamoto?

On April 23, 2011, the pseudonymous creator of Bitcoin sent a final email to developer Mike Hearn - "**I've moved on to other things**" - and was never heard from again.

Fifteen years later, debut novelist Taimour AlNeimat releases **The Day Satoshi Returned**, a 33-chapter speculative thriller that dares to answer the question: **Who is Satoshi Nakamoto?**
