“Flexibility is no longer a perk—it’s a new baseline,” Blackwell says. *“When people can balance work with life responsibilities, it opens up opportunities that simply didn’t exist before.”*

Growing evidence shows that resilience—the ability to bounce back from challenges—is now recognized as a central driver of well-being and productivity. Individuals and organizations that invest in resilience benefit from better engagement and performance in evolving environments.

“Resilience isn’t just about ‘getting through’ tough times,” says Blackwell. *“It’s about learning from them and using that clarity to shape your next step.”*
