By age 19, Mac had joined his second band, Shock Logic, an original progressive rock group that marked his transition into more serious musicianship. Between 1993 and 1995, the band performed throughout Baltimore, Maryland, playing clubs and private events while developing a distinct sound rooted in creativity and technical skill.

This period was a turning point. It was no longer just about playing drums. It was about contributing to a shared artistic vision and understanding the discipline required to perform consistently at a higher level.

[Christopher Mac Cassity](#)'s evolution continued as he entered the professional circuit, performing in wedding bands across the Washington, DC metro area. From weddings and bar mitzvahs to corporate events, he gained experience in versatility, adaptability, and professionalism.

What followed was a defining chapter in his musical career.

The band, later known as Battery Apple, proved to be as exceptional as advertised. From 1998 to 2002, they rose to prominence across the Mid-Atlantic region, building a strong following and earning recognition for their originality and performance energy.

Mac’s talent did not go unnoticed. He was voted the number four top drummer in a Music Monthly magazine poll of favorite drummers in the region, solidifying his reputation as a standout performer.

Battery Apple’s success reached new heights when the band won the Ernie Ball Battle of the Bands in Virginia, earning opportunities to perform on select dates of the Vans Warped Tour. These experiences placed Mac on larger stages, exposing him to broader audiences and elevating his presence within the music scene.

Tracks such as *I’m the Wombat* and *Full Speed* continue to reflect the band’s creative intensity and musical edge, capturing a moment in time when passion, talent, and opportunity aligned.
