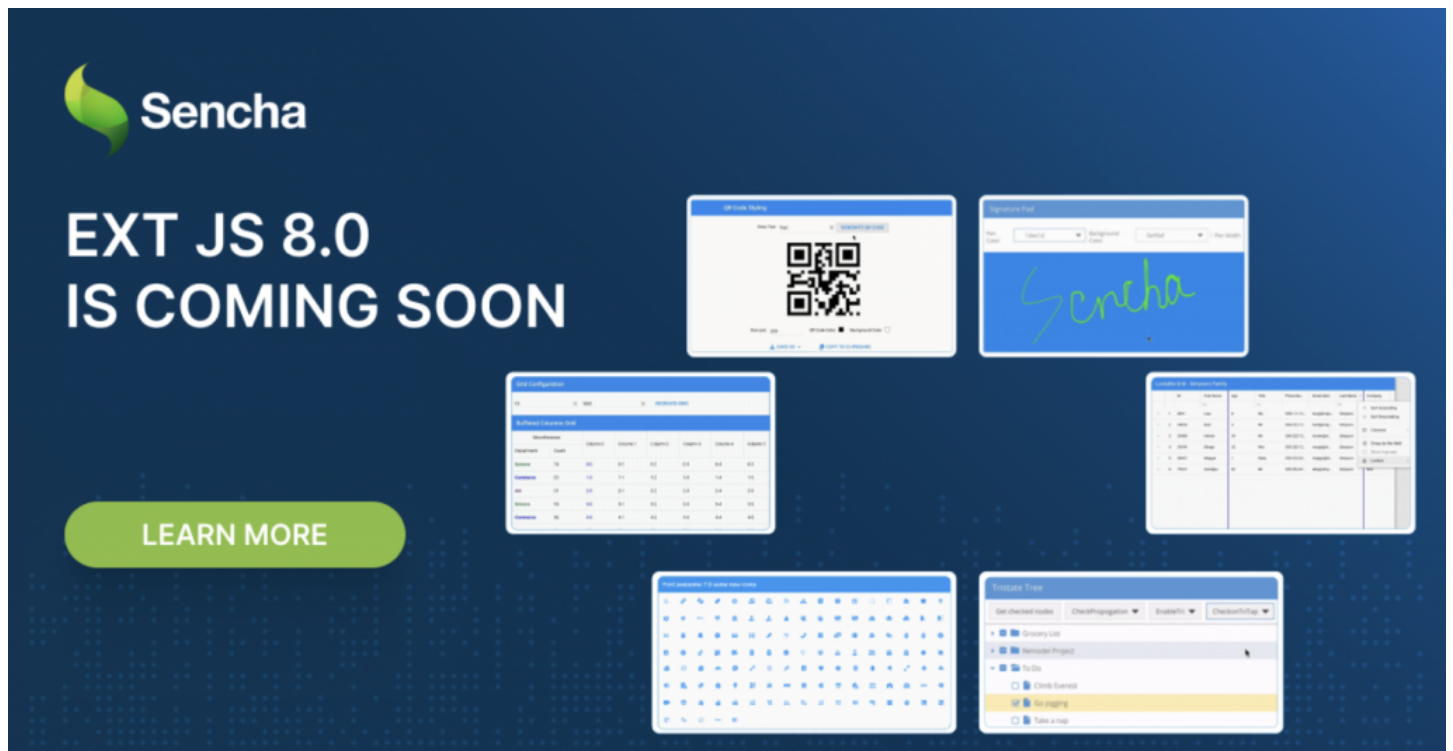


Ext JS 8.0 Is Here — Everything Enterprise Developers Need to Know

Importantly, Ext JS 8.0 is designed with minimal breaking changes from version 7.x, ensuring a smooth upgrade path for existing applications and protecting long-term development investments. Overall, the

release positions Ext JS as a modern, enterprise-ready framework capable of supporting complex, large-scale applications with efficiency and reliability.
