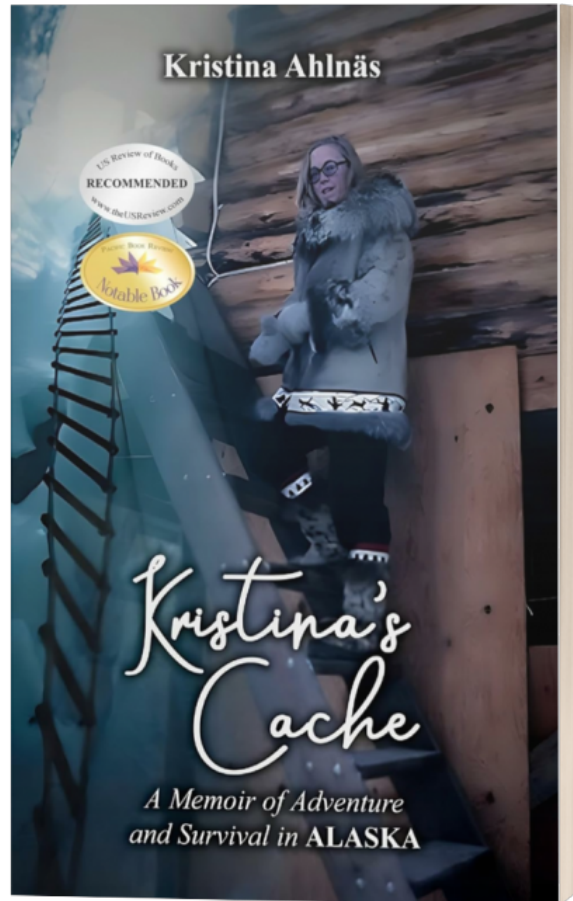


## Kristina's Cache Chronicles One Woman's Remarkable Journey in the Last Frontier

Kristina Ahlnas recounts decades of resilience, scientific discovery, and wilderness survival in Alaska

The story begins when [Ahlnas](#), a modern-day immigrant from Finland, accepts a marine geology position in Alaska after receiving a job offer by telegram. Arriving in Juneau just ten years after Alaska achieved statehood, she quickly becomes immersed in a world of opportunity and uncertainty. Her career in scientific research places her on expeditions by sea and air, often in remote locations where conditions are unpredictable and resources are scarce.

Throughout the memoir, Ahlnas recounts remarkable experiences that highlight both the beauty and the harsh realities of life in Alaska. From unexpectedly leading a scientific cruise to working on the Juneau Icefield, her adventures reflect the courage required to pursue discovery in extreme conditions. One of the most memorable chapters details her winter journey along the Alaska Highway in an un-winterized Volkswagen Beetle, navigating treacherous roads and isolation.

Determined to establish a life in the wilderness, Ahlnas eventually purchases land and constructs a small elevated shelter known as a cache. Living in this modest structure for four years—initially without electricity—she gradually builds a larger cabin with volunteer assistance. Her long-term construction project, which took a decade to complete, symbolizes the determination and ingenuity that define her story.

Spanning thirty-three years from 1969 to 2002, the memoir combines scientific work, cultural encounters, and outdoor adventure, offering readers a unique perspective on Alaska's evolving landscape and communities.

Featured as part of the Olympus Story House display during the LA Times Festival of Books 2026, held on April 18–19, 2026, at the University of Southern California, Kristina's Cache: A Memoir of Adventure and Survival in Alaska continues to stand out as an inspiring story of grit, independence, and life in the Last Frontier.
