

Kyle Nunes Medeiros & Walied Khogali Ali Focus on Community in Regent Park Discussion and Social Media Collaboration

The Regent Park meeting and accompanying Instagram post highlight ongoing dialogue around housing affordability, equity, and community-led solutions in Toronto's Ward 13.



Toronto, Ontario May 14, 2026 ([IssueWire.com](https://www.IssueWire.com)) - Community advocate [Kyle Nunes Medeiros](#) and Ward 13 candidate [Walied Khogali Ali](#) have continued their public engagement on Toronto's housing affordability challenges following a recent in-person discussion in Regent Park and a collaborative Instagram post reflecting shared concerns about equity, access, and opportunity in the city.

The meeting in Regent Park focused on ongoing affordability pressures affecting residents in Toronto's downtown east, including rising rental costs, limited access to deeply affordable housing, and systemic barriers facing low- and moderate-income households. Both participants emphasized the importance of continued dialogue between residents, community advocates, and municipal candidates as part of broader civic engagement efforts.

Following the meeting, Medeiros and Ali published a collaborative [Instagram](#) post underscoring the value of cooperation in addressing structural challenges. The post caption stated: *"Collaboration happens when great minds come together to create meaningful change. Your voice is powerful, and what you say truly matters. Today, I'm grateful for the opportunity to speak with someone who is dedicated to creating real change by giving people a fair chance at life and working to make the obstacles and barriers to entry more manageable and fair for everyone. Thank you to my good friend Walied Khogali Ali."*

The statement reflects a shared focus on community-driven solutions and the role of public dialogue in shaping more equitable urban policy outcomes. Both individuals have engaged with residents in Regent Park and surrounding neighbourhoods in recent months, contributing to ongoing discussions about housing affordability, redevelopment impacts, and tenant stability.

The collaboration adds to a growing number of grassroots conversations in Toronto centered on improving affordability metrics and ensuring that policy responses reflect lived experiences of residents in high-cost urban areas.
