

Ty Ross Emphasizes Need for Accessible Civil Legal Services for Families

Across the United States, the demand for civil legal assistance continues to grow. According to the Legal Services Corporation, low-income Americans receive inadequate or no legal help for 92 percent of their civil legal problems. Many of these issues involve housing disputes, domestic safety concerns, and debt-related matters—issues that can have immediate and long-term impacts on families.

Ross sees these challenges firsthand in his current role.

“Many people are dealing with situations that directly affect where they live and how they support their families,” he said. “Without access to legal guidance, those situations can escalate quickly.”

In Georgia and across the country, legal aid organizations play a critical role in helping individuals navigate complex systems. These services often determine whether a family can remain in their home, secure protection in difficult situations, or resolve financial disputes.

Ross emphasizes that awareness is a key part of the solution.

“A lot of people do not realize these resources exist,” he said. “Understanding where to go and when to ask for help can make a real difference.”

His background in city management also informs his perspective on the broader impact of legal access.

“When families are stable, communities are stronger,” Ross said. “Legal support is part of that foundation.”

Experts note that civil legal issues often intersect with other community challenges, including housing affordability and economic stability. Addressing these issues early can reduce long-term strain on public systems and improve overall community outcomes.

Ross encourages individuals to stay informed and take proactive steps when facing legal concerns.

“You do not have to wait until a situation becomes overwhelming,” he said. “There are resources available, and reaching out early can help protect your options.”

- Seeking information about local legal aid organizations
- Reaching out for assistance early when facing housing or legal concerns

- Staying informed about tenant rights and legal protections
