Through DuFleur Health Services, she provides psychiatric evaluation, medication management, supportive therapy, and patient-centered mental health services, including after-hours and weekend availability to improve accessibility for working patients, the uninsured, and the underinsured. Her dual certification enables her to address the critical relationship between mental health and chronic illness, particularly in oncology populations.

Myrnelle Fleur-Aime holds a Master of Science in Nursing from Chamberlain University and has consistently advanced her education and professional development throughout her career. She is also active in healthcare education and professional training as a BLS and ACLS instructor. As co-founder of Critical Professional Resources LLC, she supports healthcare providers in maintaining essential life-saving certifications, clinical readiness, and confidence in emergency response.
