

Ian Reight Calls for Greater Focus on Communication and Leadership in Healthcare

United States-based surgeon and healthcare leader Ian Reight is encouraging healthcare professionals and community members to prioritize communication, teamwork, and adaptability as healthcare systems face growing demands and rapid change.

According to the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC), the United States could face a physician shortage of up to 86,000 physicians by 2036. At the same time, healthcare organizations continue navigating staffing pressures, increasing patient demands, and rapid technological advancement. Reight says these challenges make effective leadership and collaboration more important than ever.

"Medicine is about more than procedures and diagnoses," said Reight. "People need trust and communication, especially during stressful situations. Patients want to understand what is happening, and healthcare teams need to be able to work together effectively."

Reight's perspective comes from a career that spans leadership roles in surgery, breast health, wound care and hyperbaric medicine, and robotic surgery. Before entering medicine, he also served as a volunteer firefighter and paramedic in Maryland, experiences that helped shape his leadership philosophy.

"I learned early that people look for calm leadership when things become difficult," Reight said. "In emergency situations, staying focused and communicating clearly can make a significant difference."

Research has repeatedly shown the impact communication can have on patient outcomes. The Joint Commission has identified communication breakdowns as a contributing factor in many serious medical events. Reight believes healthcare organizations can improve outcomes by creating cultures where communication, accountability, and teamwork are prioritized.

"You cannot lead effectively if you only understand your own role," he said. "You have to understand how every team works together. Healthcare is a team effort."

As medical technology continues advancing, Reight also encourages healthcare professionals to remain adaptable and committed to lifelong learning. Throughout his career, he embraced emerging technologies, including robotic surgery, while maintaining a focus on patient-centered care.

"The technology is important, but technology alone does not solve problems," Reight said. "Judgment, preparation, communication, and experience are still essential."

A Call to Action

Reight is encouraging healthcare professionals, students, and community members to take simple steps

that can strengthen communication and leadership in their own environments. He recommends practicing active listening, asking thoughtful questions, staying open to learning, and recognizing the contributions of others.

For patients and families, he encourages active participation in healthcare conversations by seeking clarity, asking questions, and building collaborative relationships with care teams.

"Good leadership is not about having all the answers," Reight said. "It is about staying prepared, staying calm, and helping people move forward together."

As healthcare continues evolving, Reight believes that communication, teamwork, and adaptability will remain among the most valuable skills for improving both patient experiences and organizational performance.
