

Robert Schopmeyer's "The Secrets of 9/11"

Author Robert Schopmeyer examines publicly available government reports, investigative records, and historical sources related to intelligence and law-enforcement activities preceding the September 11, 2001 attacks.

The book presents the author's examination of publicly available government reports, investigative records, and historical sources related to intelligence activities and law enforcement investigations preceding the September 11, 2001 attacks.

Drawing from sources including the Department of Justice Inspector General Report, the Joint Congressional Inquiry, the 9/11 Commission Report, FBI records, and accounts from investigators, Schopmeyer analyzes events leading up to the attacks and explores questions surrounding intelligence-sharing practices and investigative procedures during that period.

The author examines publicly reported information concerning intelligence monitoring of the meeting and subsequent investigative actions.

The book also discusses warnings received by U.S. agencies regarding potential terrorist threats during 2001 and reviews the challenges faced by investigators attempting to track individuals connected to al-Qaeda. Through its analysis of historical records, the book explores whether additional opportunities existed to identify and investigate future hijackers before the attacks occurred.

Rather than presenting definitive conclusions, the book encourages readers to examine historical records, government findings, and investigative accounts to better understand the circumstances surrounding one of the most significant events in modern history.
