The process can seem overwhelming. Listings disappear quickly. Competition is high. Many people are renting for the first time and may not have a rental history or established credit. That can make an already competitive search even harder.

We understand those challenges because we have spent more than thirty years working with students during one of the most important transitions in their lives.

As we shared recently, "Student housing is not a luxury. It is a practical necessity for thousands of people who come to Boston every year to study."

We also believe that "Many students value being close to campus more than having large apartments or luxury features." Choosing a practical location can often make daily life easier by reducing travel time and helping students stay connected to their university community.

One lesson has remained consistent throughout our experience. "Property management is about much more than maintaining buildings. It is about understanding the people who live in them, responding when issues arise and building trust over time."

That same principle applies to renters. Good preparation, clear communication and realistic expectations often make the housing search much smoother.

It is also important to remember that hesitation from some landlords is not always personal. As we explained, "Many students are renting for the first time. They may have limited rental history, limited credit history or require co-signers." Understanding those concerns allows students to prepare stronger rental applications and communicate more confidently.

Finally, we continue to believe that "We want to provide quality housing that meets real needs." That commitment has guided our work for decades and reflects the important role students play in the communities they join.

Why This Matters

The need for practical student housing continues to grow.

- The Greater Boston area is home to more than 250,000 college and university students, making it one of the largest student populations in the United States.
- Dozens of colleges and universities report that many students live off campus because on-campus housing cannot accommodate total enrolment.
- Higher education supports hundreds of thousands of jobs across Massachusetts and contributes billions of dollars to the state's economy each year.
- Students and visiting family members support local restaurants, cafés, shops, public transport, hotels and neighbourhood businesses throughout the academic year.

What You Can Do This Week

- Start your housing search as early as possible.
- Make a checklist of the features you genuinely need rather than those you simply want.
- Gather important documents, including identification and proof of enrolment.
- Speak with your university's housing office about available resources.
- If needed, arrange a co-signer before beginning your search.
- Learn about the neighbourhoods surrounding your campus.
- Create a realistic monthly housing budget that includes transport and utilities.
- Ask questions before signing a lease so you understand your responsibilities.
- Keep communication polite, prompt and organised when contacting housing providers.
- Focus on finding a practical home that supports your studies and daily routine rather than trying to find a perfect property.

Finding housing can feel stressful, but preparation goes a long way. Small steps taken today can make the process easier tomorrow.
