Many talented professionals assume that strong technical performance alone will earn advancement. Baldari says this misconception causes many careers to stall.

"Organizations promote individuals they believe can represent the business under pressure," he says. "That requires credibility, composure, collaboration, and the ability to influence without relying on authority."

One of the biggest components of executive presence, according to Baldari, is learning to communicate strategically. Rather than simply reporting problems, effective leaders present thoughtful solutions while demonstrating an understanding of the broader business.

"Senior leaders aren't looking for people who can identify issues," he says. "They're looking for professionals who understand how decisions affect customers, employees, finances, and long-term organizational goals."

Another overlooked aspect is consistency.

Baldari encourages professionals to approach every meeting, presentation, and conversation as an opportunity to reinforce their reputation. Small interactions accumulate over time, shaping how colleagues and executives perceive leadership potential.

"Your reputation isn't built during your annual review," Baldari says. "It's built through hundreds of everyday moments where people decide whether you're someone they would trust to lead larger initiatives."

Baldari also emphasizes emotional discipline during periods of uncertainty. Professionals who remain calm, adaptable, and solutions-focused during organizational change often distinguish themselves from peers.

"Executive presence isn't about appearing perfect," he explains. "It's about helping other people feel confident because you're in the room."

He also encourages emerging leaders to invest in relationships across departments rather than remaining isolated within their own teams. Cross-functional credibility often becomes a deciding factor when promotion decisions are made.

"The strongest leaders understand how the entire organization succeeds," Baldari says. "Building trust across functions creates influence that extends well beyond your job description."

Ultimately, Baldari believes executive presence is less about image and more about consistency of character.

"When your actions consistently reflect integrity, accountability, and strategic thinking, people begin seeing you as a leader long before your business card changes."
