Forward Vision and Concluding Legacy

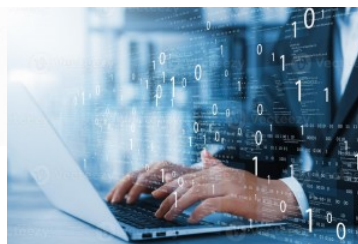
As Dr Beeram's journey continues, it remains guided by disciplined thinking, responsible leadership,
