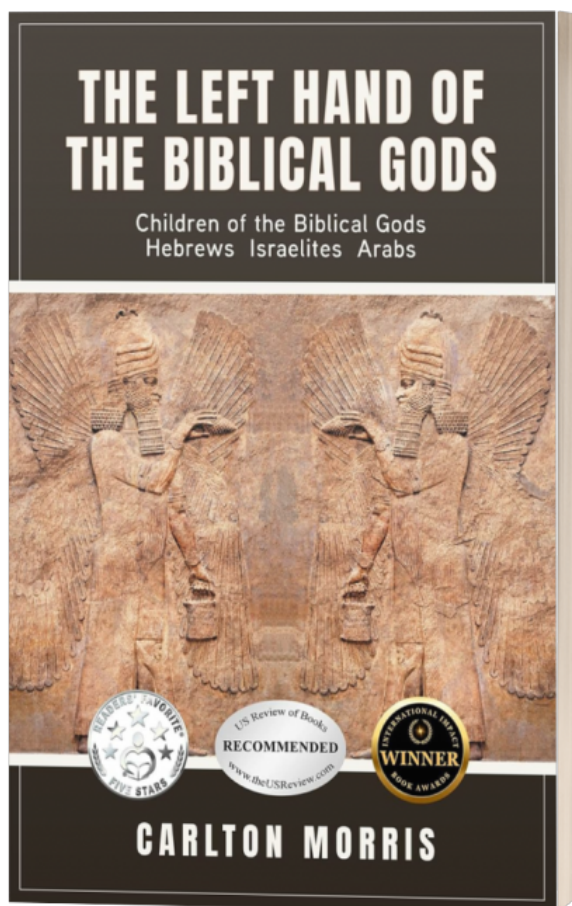


The Left Hand of the Biblical Gods Challenges Traditional Interpretations of Scripture and Religion
