

Apolosign Brings the Family Calendar Beyond the Kitchen Wall

Digital family calendars and portable smart TVs now share one household schedule, giving families the same view of plans, chores and to-dos wherever they are at home.

As the new school year gets underway, practice schedules, pickup times, appointments and activities can quickly turn a kitchen refrigerator into a paper-covered command center. [Apolosign](https://www.apolosign.com), a U.S. smart display brand, is taking a different approach: putting the family schedule on multiple screens throughout the home.

The company's digital family calendars and portable smart TVs now work together through a shared dashboard, allowing information entered on one device to appear across the system. A parent can add a pickup time on the kitchen calendar, for example, and see that same schedule on a portable TV moved to the patio, living room or another part of the house.

"The problem with the traditional family calendar was never the calendar itself," said Fyhack, CEO of Apolosign. "It was that the information lived in one spot, and nobody necessarily walked past that spot when they needed it. A family calendar only works if everybody can actually see it."

One Calendar, Two Ways to Use It

Apolosign Digital Calendar features [a dual-mode system](#) that combines a dedicated Calendar Mode with an Android-based dashboard on the same display.

Calendar Mode is designed for household organization. It can sync with Google Calendar, Outlook, iCloud, Yahoo and Cozi, while also supporting chore assignments, to-do lists, meal planning and a shared message board.

Android Mode turns the same display into a customizable smart dashboard, allowing families to add widgets for weather, music, doorbell feeds and other information they want readily available.

The digital calendar is available in three sizes—15.6-inch, 21.5-inch and 27-inch—and comes in four color options. The 27-inch model is available in both 1080p and 4K configurations.

For parents, the chore system adds another layer to the household schedule. Tasks can be assigned point values, with completed chores contributing toward rewards. Children can mark tasks as completed directly on the display, turning the family calendar into a shared accountability tool rather than simply a place to view appointments.

A Second Screen That Moves With the Family

Apolosign also offers a 32-inch [Smart Portable TV](#), designed to bring the same connected family experience to other areas of the home.

Built on a five-wheel stand and powered by a 15,000mAh battery, the TV can operate for approximately six hours and move between rooms without being connected to an outlet. Its display can swivel, tilt and rotate 90 degrees, making it suitable for both traditional viewing and vertical video.

The TV runs Android 16 with Google Play and supports streaming applications, while an 8MP camera and microphone enable video calls. The 1080p model starts at \$719, with 4K and 24-inch options also available.

Through the shared dashboard, the TV can also display the same family schedule, weather information and to-do items available on the digital calendar, keeping important household information visible beyond the kitchen.

Designed Around the Way Families Actually Move

The idea behind the connected experience is simple: family information shouldn't have to stay in one place.

A schedule might be created in the kitchen in the morning, checked on a TV in the living room after school, and viewed again outside while the family is spending time on the patio. By sharing the same dashboard across devices, Apolosign aims to turn individual smart displays into a more connected household information system.

The company says its calendar features are available without a monthly subscription.

“People are tired of paying every month for a screen they already bought,” Fyhack said. “We wanted the

core calendar experience to be straightforward: buy the device, use the features, and keep your family schedule in one place without another monthly bill.”
