As fall approaches in Libertyville, Illinois, residential lawn maintenance begins to shift before the mowing season ends.

Fall Lawn Maintenance Begins Before Mowing Stops

Fall lawn maintenance does not begin only after the final mowing visit.

Cool season grass can continue growing while trees are already dropping leaves.

That creates a period during September, October, and November when residential properties may require both weekly lawn mowing and recurring leaf removal.

For properties with mature deciduous trees, leaf accumulation may occur in repeated waves rather than during one final drop.

Managing those leaves periodically can prevent heavy accumulation from remaining on the turf for extended periods.

Weekly Lawn Mowing Continues Through the Late Growing Season

Evo Lawn & Landscape structures its Libertyville mowing route around recurring weekly service during the active growing season.

Typical mowing service can include mowing accessible turf, string trimming around included obstacles, maintaining defined hard edges, and clearing loose grass from serviced paved surfaces.

The exact service scope depends on the property.

Mowing Height Changes as Seasonal Conditions Change

The company adjusts mowing height according to turf condition and seasonal growth rather than using one fixed height throughout the year.

When conditions allow, the typical summer mowing range is approximately **3.75 to 4 inches**.

Later in the growing season, mowing height may gradually move closer to approximately **3.25 inches** as growth slows.

Moisture, rainfall, temperature, shade, and current turf condition can all affect the final cutting height used on a particular visit.

Leaf Removal Becomes More Important as Tree Drop Increases

Leaf accumulation can vary significantly between Libertyville properties.

Homes with mature trees may experience repeated leaf drop over several weeks, while properties with limited tree coverage may require substantially less seasonal cleanup.

Wind can also move leaves into lawns, fence lines, landscape edges, sidewalks, and other collection areas.

Because of that variability, recurring weekly leaf removal can be more practical for heavily treed properties than waiting until the end of the season for one large cleanup.

Weekly Leaf Removal Helps Manage Repeated Accumulation

Recurring leaf removal focuses on managing leaves as they fall rather than allowing heavy layers to remain until most trees are bare.

The goal is not to keep a lawn completely free of leaves every day.

The objective is to prevent repeated seasonal leaf drop from becoming excessive buildup between scheduled visits.

This approach can be especially relevant during October and November, when different tree species may shed at different times.

Lawn Mowing and Leaf Removal Often Overlap

During part of the fall season, mowing and leaf removal may occur during the same maintenance period.

Grass may still require cutting even when leaves are already accumulating across the lawn.

As temperatures decline and turf growth slows, mowing becomes less dominant while leaf removal becomes a larger portion of the weekly workload.

Eventually, grass growth stops and remaining leaf cleanup becomes the primary seasonal concern.

"Fall does not arrive all at once on a residential lawn," said Gerry, owner of Evo Lawn & Landscape. "Grass may still be growing while trees are already dropping leaves, so weekly mowing and leaf removal can overlap for several weeks."

Wet Conditions Can Affect Both Mowing and Leaf Removal

Fall weather can create different challenges for turf and leaf cleanup.

Evo Lawn & Landscape does not force mowing when saturated turf creates a high risk of rutting, tearing, or unnecessary lawn damage.

When ground conditions are too wet, mowing may be delayed until the property can be serviced more safely.

Wet leaves can also become heavier, compact against the turf, and require more handling than dry leaves.

Cooler temperatures and shorter daylight can further slow drying conditions later in the season.

Property Layout Influences Fall Maintenance Work

Two Libertyville properties with similar lawn sizes can require very different amounts of fall maintenance.

Factors that can affect the workload include:

- Mature tree coverage
- Leaf volume
- Mowable turf area
- Backyard access
- Gate width
- Fences and corners where leaves collect
- Landscape beds
- Sidewalks and parkway turf
- Slopes and drainage areas
- Wet or compacted leaves
- Whether leaves must be hauled away

Property conditions also influence the amount of mowing, trimming, and cleanup required during recurring visits.

Residential Access Remains Important During Fall

Recurring service depends on safe and practical access to the property.

Approximately **36 inches of usable gate access** is generally required for the company's primary mowing equipment to reach fenced backyard areas.

Homeowners are also expected to keep gates accessible and remove movable items from turf areas before scheduled service.

This becomes increasingly important in fall because hoses, toys, decorations, and other objects can become harder to see when partially covered by leaves.

The Final Mow Depends on Actual Turf Conditions

There is no single final mowing date that applies to every Libertyville lawn.

Grass growth depends on temperature, moisture, sunlight, irrigation, and current turf health.

Some lawns can continue growing later into the season than others.

For that reason, final mowing decisions are based on actual turf conditions rather than a fixed calendar date.

Leaf drop follows a similarly variable pattern.

Different tree species can shed at different times, which means final leaf removal may occur after some neighboring trees have already become bare.

Late Season Maintenance Is a Gradual Transition

The shift from summer mowing into fall property maintenance happens over several weeks rather than on one specific date.

During that period, the same Libertyville property may require continued mowing, trimming, and edging while accumulating increasing amounts of leaves.

As grass growth slows, leaf removal becomes a larger part of recurring property maintenance.

This seasonal overlap is one reason fall maintenance needs can vary considerably between residential properties, even within the same neighborhood.
