Darwin's Heart explores how cultures and belief systems across history have understood the heart as more than a biological pump—as the seat of courage, love, memory, identity, and the soul itself. The book draws from medical history, anthropology, archaeology, and spirituality to create an interdisciplinary reflection intended to encourage both medical professionals and general readers to reconsider how the human heart has been understood across time.

Spanning 125 pages and categorized within the Medical History & Records genre, *Darwin's Heart* is concise yet expansive—offering a broad historical inquiry in a compact format. Rather than functioning as a conventional medical text, the book invites readers to reflect on the relationship between science, culture, and the enduring symbolic importance of the human heart.
