Condo owners face a different set of coverage questions than single-family homeowners, since some systems are shared or managed through an HOA, which is why HomeAssure Administration offers condo-specific plan options built around the systems and appliances condo

owners are actually responsible for, rather than a one-size-fits-all single-family plan.

For homes on septic rather than municipal sewer service, septic tank and system repairs can run into the thousands of dollars, and [HomeAssure Administration](#)'s septic system coverage option is designed to help homeowners in these situations avoid an unplanned, out-of-pocket expense when a system fails. Mold-related repairs raise similar questions from homeowners, particularly around what triggers coverage and what does not, and HomeAssure Administration encourages homeowners to review the specific mold-related terms in any home warranty contract, including its own, before assuming a scenario is or is not covered.

Homeowners in newly built homes often wonder whether a home warranty is worth adding on top of a builder's warranty. “Our goal with this education push is simple,” the spokesperson at HomeAssure Admin added. “We want homeowners making an informed decision, not a decision based on what they assume is or isn't covered.”
