One important consideration is whether a wheeled skid steer or compact track loader is better suited to the application. Wheeled skid steers are generally lighter and easier to transport and are well suited to flat, paved surfaces, industrial facilities, warehouses, and similar environments. Compact track loaders provide increased flotation and traction on rough, slippery, soft, or uneven terrain. These differences can influence transportation requirements, maneuverability, and how effectively equipment performs under changing ground conditions.

Attachments further expand the range of work compact equipment can perform. Depending on the application, skid steers and compact loaders can be configured with tools for mowing, grading, drilling, land clearing, demolition, and other specialized jobs. Earth augers, for example, can support projects involving fence posts and utility work, while mowing and clearing attachments can extend a machine's usefulness for landscaping and land management.

JCB skid steers also incorporate the manufacturer's Powerboom™ single-arm design. Unlike conventional machines that use loader arms on both sides of the cab, the JCB configuration uses a single loader arm and side-entry access. The design is intended to improve operator visibility and provide cab access without requiring the operator to climb over an attachment or enter beneath the loader arm.

These considerations are particularly relevant in [southern New Mexico](#), where compact equipment can be used across a wide range of industries. Construction companies may need machines for clearing sites, preparing foundations, or moving materials, while agricultural and landscaping operations can use compact equipment for land clearing and property maintenance. Material-handling requirements in industrial and commercial environments can present another set of operating conditions.

Dealer support is another factor businesses can evaluate when selecting equipment. A machine's usefulness continues well beyond the initial purchase or rental. Access to technicians, replacement parts, routine maintenance, and assistance with equipment selection can become important when contractors are managing active projects and trying to limit equipment downtime.
