Turning Unused Space Into Functional Storage

One of the biggest advantages of custom cabinetry is the ability to use space that might otherwise be overlooked. A narrow wall, a recessed area, a corner, or a space beneath a window can serve as useful storage without making the room feel crowded.

[Atlanta Bookshelves](#) has designed window seats with storage underneath, for example, creating seating while providing a discreet place for blankets, toys, and other household items. Custom bookcases can also be built around windows, allowing homeowners to retain natural light while adding substantial storage and display space.

This approach can be particularly useful in older Atlanta homes, where rooms may have unusual proportions, decorative details, or architectural elements that do not work easily with mass-produced furniture.

Designing Around Vaulted and High Ceilings

Tall or vaulted ceilings can create another challenge. Standard bookcases and cabinets may leave significant amounts of unused wall space above them. Custom cabinetry provides a way to take advantage of that vertical space. Atlanta Bookshelves has completed a library design that extends approximately 14 feet high and 15 feet across, incorporating multiple shelves and a rolling ladder to make the upper storage accessible.

For homeowners with high ceilings, cabinetry can also be designed to incorporate crown molding and other details that help the finished installation look as though it were part of the original architecture.

Making Fireplaces and Mantles Part of the Design

Fireplaces and mantels often become the natural focal point of a room, but they can also make surrounding walls difficult to furnish. Rather than treating the fireplace as an obstacle, custom cabinetry

can be designed around it.

Atlanta Bookshelves has created built-ins that incorporate existing mantles and fireplace structures. Cabinetry, shelving, molding, and other details can be coordinated so the different elements appear to form one cohesive design.

The same principle can apply to entertainment centers. Cabinets and shelving can be positioned around a television while providing dedicated storage for media equipment, books, decorative objects, and other belongings.

Working With the Details That Make a Home Unique

Custom cabinetry can also accommodate smaller architectural details that might otherwise complicate a project. Trim, molding, vents, electrical outlets, brickwork, handrails, and other existing features can be incorporated into the design rather than simply worked around.
