Which Categories Define the Portfolio of a Medical Uniform Manufacturer from China?

The manufacturing scope at E-SONG APPAREL covers scrub sets, nurse-oriented medical garments, a white long lab coat, and a washable surgical gown within its product universe. That breadth lets buyers build a sourcing program across everyday clinical apparel and more specialized garment formats. This avoids the need to start from a single scrub SKU or piece together multiple factory networks.

Scrub products span V-neck, Mandarin-collar, jogger, cargo, flare-leg, and other configurations. Simultaneously, the lab coat and washable surgical gown create separate specification paths for coat construction and barrier-garment requirements, ensuring that each clinical role receives the correct garment format.

How Do Fabric Families Change Medical Uniform Sourcing?

Fabric selection changes stretch, structure, care behavior, garment weight, and the silhouettes that can be developed. [E-SONG APPAREL](#) offers four medical-uniform fabric families. They include 65% polyester and 35% cotton in woven and knitted constructions, with more than 15 running colors. A 90% polyester and 10% spandex, 140gsm option provides 4-way stretch, breathability, quick drying, and more than 15 running colors. A 55% cotton, 42% polyester, and 3% spandex option provides 2-way stretch and a soft touch. The 72% polyester, 21% rayon, and 7% spandex option is 175–205gsm, 4-way stretch, wrinkle resistant, antimicrobial, anti-static, and available in more than 15 running colors.

A buyer developing a coordinated range can use stretch blends for fitted or mobility-oriented scrubs while keeping more structured woven options for garments that need a different hand and silhouette. This material flexibility prevents the compromise of forcing a single fabric across entirely different garment categories.

The fiber blend should remain tied to the selected garment and end-use brief. This is because the fabric properties of one scrub or coat do not automatically transfer to the entire medical-uniform range. Specifying the exact composition and weight for each style ensures that the finished product meets the durability and comfort expectations of the end user.

How Should Buyers Compare Scrubs, Lab Coats and Surgical Gowns?

The three categories solve different uniform-program needs, so the useful comparison starts with garment function, construction, material, and required documentation rather than a single fabric preference. A structured approach to specification prevents category confusion during the sample and quotation phases.

Scrubs Support the Broadest Fit and Style Range

Scrubs offer the widest assortment of stretch fabrics, necklines, pant cuts, colors, and private-label design options, making them the most flexible category for differentiated healthcare-uniform collections. This variation allows brands to target different demographics, from traditional healthcare settings to modern aesthetic clinics.

Lab Coats Use a More Defined Coat Construction

The white long lab coat uses 65% polyester and 35% cotton Ultra Twill with a snap-front closure, unisex fit, and back vent. This gives sourcing teams a concrete construction baseline for sample evaluation and

ensures the garment provides the required coverage and professional structure.

Washable Surgical Gowns Require Application-Specific Specification

The washable surgical gown carries AAMI PB70 Level 1 and Level 3 specifications, one-size construction, machine-care instructions, and material testing across more than 150 sterilized washing cycles. Regulated barrier programs should place the required standard, protection level, test scope, and acceptance criteria directly in the procurement specification to align with facility compliance protocols.

What Manufacturing Capacity Supports Multi-Category Orders?

A multi-category medical-uniform program depends on production capacity as well as assortment breadth. E-SONG APPAREL operates an owned Linyi factory with 120 workers and also uses subcontracted production lines. Monthly production capacity is 200,000 units.

Different uniform styles can be allocated across different production lines, helping buyers plan mixed programs. E-SONG APPAREL uses a pre-production meeting, inline inspection, and final inspection as its quality-control sequence. Customers may also arrange a third-party final inspection at the factory.

Before bulk ordering, buyers can request fabric swatches and a development sample. The development-sample fee is USD 100 per set and can be credited against the bulk order. What Should a Medical Uniform RFQ Include?

- Garment category and intended professional use.
- Fabric composition, weight, stretch level, and finish requirements.
- Top, coat, gown, and pant construction details.
- Size range, color range, and gender or unisex fit requirements.
- Logo method, label, packaging, and private-label details.
- Quantity by style and color. When E-SONG APPAREL fabric is used, the MOQ is 300 pieces per style per color.
- Required standards or test criteria for regulated garment applications.
